 - ii. Hydro cycle (Jackie)
 1. Very successful
 2. Full class of 12, 10 participated
 3. Paid for by Manitoba hydro
 4. A mix of experienced and new cyclists
 5. Stayed away from talking about safety. This is for people to commute to and from work and was to help them feel more confident on the road. Didn't want to make anyone feel as though they would be any safer if they took the course. They really emphasized confidence.
 6. Survey
 - a. Everyone gave high marks

- b. One experienced cyclist felt he did not learn anything
 - c. The other experienced cyclists found it quite informative
 - d. The beginner's wanted to have more content in the basics
 - e. The participants thought the level of ride was just right
 - f. All but one would recommend the course to others
 - g. Some suggested that groups be separated based on level of experience
 - 7. 4 parts
 - a. Some in class theory
 - b. Abc check
 - c. Cycling technique
 - d. Road portion
 - i. All participants were comfortable riding 5 km
 - ii. A course was setup so that riders could practice some techniques
 - iii. Participants were each given an opportunity to lead the ride
 - iv. A tour of the bike facilities at the workplace was given
 - 8. Conclusions

 - b. People said they would pay between \$10 to \$30 for the course
 - i. The actual cost of the course was \$600 divided between 12 people
 - 9. Jackie recommends that if were to offer this to another group, that we have materials put together for the facilitator to promote the course.
